SUCCULENTS

Succulents by their nature are hardy, drought-tolerant plants. This makes them desirable garden plants in a water-stressed world. This same attribute allows them to survive if they escape to our bushland.

Fortunately, most only spread slowly, by vegetative means, but a single leaf can often start a new plant. Care is required when removing or transporting these plants.
