COMMON WEEDS OF THE ANGLESEA FORESHORE


Weeds are plants growing where they are not wanted, usually because they cause a problem of some kind. Environmental weeds crowd out our native plants, change nutrient balances and reduce habitat values for animals and birds that depend on the original species mix.

Weeds can be grasses and herbs, or shrubs or even trees. They are usually more vigorous than average and spread easily. Some "easy-to-grow" garden plants have these features, but most do not. This poster shows some of the more common ones found along the foreshore.






