ENVIRONMENTAL WEEDS

MORE SMALL "GARDEN" WEEDS

Many of these carpeting weeds crowd out Australian species along roadsides, beside paths, throughout flora reserves and National Parks. They can have a negative impact especially where small endangered Australian species grow, e.g. in heathland orchid habitat.

These weeds also seed prolifically thus enhancing their ability to spread. While not as invasive as some of the larger weed species it is worthwhile to restrict their growth within and beyond gardens.
