BERRIES

Many plants with large numbers of berries are easily spread by birds and animals. Often grown because the berries are either good to eat, e.g. Blackberries, or because the berries are really attractive. These plants easily grow where they are not wanted. They may be ground covers, shrubs, climbers or trees. Once again introduced from around the world these plants grow in a variety of habitats.
